This seminar is titled "Pushing the envelope" and will be presented by Craig Peterson, CASA Aviation Safety Advisor.


Using case studies, the seminar explores:



Search and Rescue


On 28th June 2021, Bunbury Aero Club's Alex Karatamoglou was contacted to see if it was possible to hire aircraft and pilots to conduct a search of the South West region for missing person Anna 'Tina' Johnson.

That night a post was submitted on the club's Facebook page calling out for pilots and spotters willing to volunteer their time the next morning - we received an overwhelming response.

In total, we had 8 aircraft deployed each with a designated area of the south west to search they included:

Our club manager and flight instructor, Catherine piloted VH-EEF with two spotters on-board searching the Collie area. While flying over bush north of the Collie townsite, a reflection of light into the aircraft caught their attention. Realizing the light was off a white SUV matching the description of Tina's vehicle. The discovery was then called into Alex, and club member and Police representative Andy Carsen, who then took off in Alex's helicopter to better identify the vehicle.





Thankfully the vehicle spotted was Tina's; providing Police and SES crews a starting point to search for Tina, as she was not with her vehicle.

The following morning, we received the wonderful news that Anna 'Tina' Johnson had been found alive and well in bush land not far from where her vehicle was spotted.

Again, thank you to everyone who had graciously donated their time into the search. We are so proud of our community.

Jets arriving at Bunbury?

On Sunday 30th May, the Sydney Morning Herald published an article titled "Pandemic no barrier to private jet arrivals in Australia".

The article claims that celebrities and high wealth individuals were bypassing Australia's COVID-19 regulations by arriving at regional cities with Bunbury Airport being the main point of access, receiving 22 private jets from the USA all during the month of May?!

This article caused much uproar in the community as many Australian citizens at the time were still aboard unable to return to Australia due to border closures and restrictions.

But aviators quickly identified several issues with the article including:

- Aircraft don't have sufficient range to be able to fly non-stop from the east coast of the USA to the west coast of Australia.
- Bunbury's runway length of 1,015m is insufficient for use by private jets.
- Boigu Island (Qld), which was also mentioned in the article, only has a runway length of 730m.

This raised much concern with WA Police who immediately investigated these claims! They found the journalist misinterpreted the flight data and the aircraft attributed to Bunbury were actually flying to Burlington Airport in Vermont - the aircraft weren't leaving the USA.

The article even caught the eye of multiple luxury real estate agents in the south west, calling up the airport asking what celebrities were here - as they were trying to sell them private properties!
